Alice resumed meeting by thanking the veterans for their service

- Alice welcomed 2 visitors

- Members with April birthdays were recognized

Meeting was turned over to LaWonne McCoy to introduce the evenings speaker

- Susan Pierce was introduced. Susan works at Pineapple Fabric. She has designed a line of quilt patterns and kits known as Miss Susie Quilts. These patterns reflect a Civil War theme based around her family

After presentation Alice Wise resumed with the business phase of the meeting

- Treasurer, Tracy Burkart, reported no change since the newsletter published the amounts

- Secretary minutes were approved without change and seconded

- Membership, Linda Nichols, reported that membership forms would be available at the quilt show

- Newsletter updates not available due to Ellen Hart's absence

Quilts of Valor

We are encouraged by the interest being shown in our efforts. Two of our new members stopped at our table during the show and expressed interest in making quilts. Additionally, a lady from Asheboro who was active in Quilts of Valor in Idaho before she moved to Asheboro has reached out to become involved in our efforts here. Now that we have the show behind us, we're looking for everyone to take a breath, then consider making a square or top. We have plenty of fabric and will be happy for you to come 'shop' in my sewing room to choose which ones you want to use for a top. Alternately, I will be happy to provide a precut kit with instructions for making a square or top.

I will not be at the next meeting as we will be in FL attending our granddaughter's graduation from FSU. I will be back on May 3 and will be happy to rendezvous with you, if you want a kit or have you come select your fabric in my sewing room.

We received two nominations for quilts during the show and will be receiving names from the national website before our next award ceremony in October. Additionally, we are looking at opportunities at the new VA hospital and talking to a couple of groups who work to secure housing for homeless veterans. Our goal is to provide each homeless veteran a quilt as he/she moves into housing.

We have awarded over 300,000 quilts nationwide but the need is so much larger than that so please consider making a top. We'll get it quilted, if you'll make it.

Scrap Buster #8 *Month 5*

WEEK 5 INSTRUCTIONS

Note: Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and stitch right sides together for all construction unless otherwise instructed. It is important to keep same units and pieces together. We suggest using sandwich bags. Be sure to label each bag with the unit or piece reference name.

- Sew a D-H and E-H unit to the I sides of 34 I-J units to make J Corner Units as shown in Figure 8. Press seams away from I-J.

- Sew H to the I sides of the remaining 34 I-J units as shown in Figure 9. Press seams toward H.

- Sew an H-I-J unit to opposite sides of the four-patch units to make 17 four-patch rows as shown in Figure 10. Press seams toward the four-patch units.

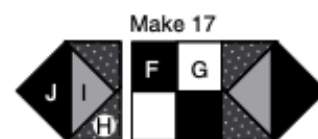
