"Patterns," a national exhibit devoted exclusively to her work, was on display at The National Humanities Center in North Carolina. One of the cofounders of the BeeFF's bee in Cary, she hosts meetings, amateur work days and group retreats in her home. Known as a caring instructor with a warm sense of humor, she is eager to share her love of the craft with quilters of every level.
