Please remember the important dates for our Quilt Show.

Quilt ENTRY forms: Deadline date - Friday, February 25, 2022. You can deliver completed entry form(s) to Ellen Hart at our February meeting. If mailed, postmark NO LATER than Friday, February 25, 2022. Print out the rules, definitions and entry forms from our website, hottqg.com.

Volunteer sign up sheets will be at our February and March meetings. Your help is required to make our show a success! See Mary Jo Wimberly to sign up for as many hours as possible.

Turn in quilts - Tuesday, April 5, 2022 at the Swisher Center. 1pm to 7 pm. (NO quilts will be accepted at April meeting)

Judging of quilts - Wednesday, April 6, 2022 at the Swisher Center. Gloria Stickney and her volunteers are the only members allowed in the room during judging day. (Also, on Wednesday, the Winston Salem Fairgrounds staff will be setting up quilt racks and drapes. This should insure a smooth set up day.) Several of our Quilt Show Chairs will be overseeing the set up.

Set up Quilt Show - Thursday, April 7, 2022. All members and volunteers are needed to hang the quilts, set up Granny's Boutique, Admissions, Silent Auction, Books, etc. Vendors will also be setting up this day. We need to be "Show ready" by the end of the day on Thursday.

Friday, April 8 and Saturday April 9, 2022 - The doors to our Quilt Show OPEN! Show hours 9am to 5 pm each day.

Exciting Opportunity to Sell Your Quilts

The Quilt Show Committee met on January 11, 2022. Everyone is doing a great job and plans are progressing for our April 8-9, 2022 Together Again show. We will probably have several vendor spaces to rent. We discussed possible uses for these empty spaces. One idea would be to offer members a chance to sell their personal quilts. It was voted by the Show Committees to charge a commission of 15% for each member's quilt price in lieu of the normal \$175 rental fee. This offer is to help our members and still make some funds from an unused vendor space.

However, all current committee chairs are extremely busy with all their normal duties. A member MUST volunteer to chair this opportunity. Rules and methods of sale must be determined by this Chairperson. Anyone selling their quilt must be able to help man the space. Funds for this space would be separate from the Guild's treasury. Commission fees would be payable to the Guild from the seller. There is a lot to be considered and approved by the Quilt Show Chairpersons.

Somewhere therein, big enough for us to see A heart- you chose how many, surprise me.

In a prominent spot, there is to be a pretty flower blossom.

Should you add more than one, it will be ever so awesome.

Outside borders will be up to you How many you want - one, three or two.

Please think out of the box- create and go Plug in your machine and sew, sew, sew!

WEEK 2 INSTRUCTIONS

Note: Use a ¼" seam allowance and stitch right sides together for all construction unless otherwise instructed. It is important to keep same units and pieces together. We suggest using sandwich bags. Be sure to label each bag with the unit or piece reference name.

 Stitch a C triangle to both short ends of an A rectangle (Figure 1). Press seams toward C. Repeat to make 18 A-C units.

 Stitch D to right short end and E to left short end of a B rectangle (Figure 2).
 Press seams away from B. Repeat to make 18 B-D-E units.

 Stitch a C triangle to the top of a B-D-E unit referring to Figure 3. Press seam toward C. Repeat to make 18 B Corner Units.


