#### **WEEK 7 INSTRUCTIONS**

**Note:** Use a ¼" seam allowance and stitch right sides together for all construction unless otherwise instructed. It is important to keep same units and pieces together. We suggest using sandwich bags. Be sure to label each bag with the unit or piece reference name.

- Join three The House That Jack Built blocks with two Midnight Star blocks to make a row as shown in Figure 11.
   Press seams toward The House That Jack Built blocks. Repeat to make four of Row 1.
- Join three Midnight Star blocks with two The House That Jack Built blocks to make a row, again referring to Figure 11. Press seams toward The House That Jack Built blocks. Repeat to make three of Row 2.
- Join the rows alternately beginning with Row 1 to complete the pieced center. Press seams in one direction.



### QOV Update

I was honored to award Quilts of Valor to two Vietnam veterans during May:
One to Rod Ryan who served in the Marines (on the ground). He called the day after he received his quilt and told me that the quilt means more to him than all of the medals he received during the war.



The other went to Bill Wheeler who was an Army Airborne Ranger. He received a bronze star for valor and two Purple Hearts. His second injury from an IED resulted in 18 months in Walter Reed Medical Center where he was told he most likely would not walk again; yet as the pictures show, he is upright and mobile. In his thank you note, Bill wrote: I was in Vietnam more than 50 years ago. It is extremely comforting to know that after all these years, there are people such as you who remember and honor the service of this nation's veterans.

Our next award ceremony will be at the October meeting. If you have a family member who is a veteran or is active military and would like to nominate him/her for a quilt, please give me a call. Also, I have precut kits and/or fabric if you would like to participate by making a top. I'll even deliver.





### To the membership:

We propose to have a new committee created for our retreats. Due to problems in the past with members being responsible personally and financially for the retreat contract and monies, we propose that the Guild add a committee to our Bylaws.

### History:

The retreat has always been advertised as a Guild retreat, yet the responsibility of the retreat contract/monies has been for the individual member who plans the retreat. Any monies collected was handled by the individual member. With Covid restricting our ability to hold a retreat in the last two years, it fell upon the retreat planner to collect the refund from the retreat center and reimburse the members who signed up for the retreat. Due to personal reasons, it has taken some time to get this done. It would have been completed in a more timely manner had it been handled by the Guild. Without this bylaw change, there is no protection for guild members from losing their retreat payments in the future.

### Bylaws Addition Proposal:

Article VIII, Section 12. RETREAT - In charge of setting up and making all arrangements for retreats. Communicates information and deadlines with participating members. All monies for the retreat will be deposited/disbursed by the Treasurer utilizing the Guild main account.

This bylaw change will be discussed and voted on at the August meeting.

Update to bylaws to include a retreat committee -

Tracy Burkart explained need for update due to problems in the past two years-

- Explained in past one person handled everything. No monies were handle by auild treasury.

Last two years retreat was cancelled. Fees have not been returned

- Group discussed pros and cons. Will be further addressed and voted on at the August meeting.

## WANT TO GO TO THE AQS SHOW IN PADUCAH?

We will be traveling on April 25 to Paducah, Kentucky, and returning on April 29, 2023. We will be traveling on a motor coach from the Christian Tours company, however, this trip is NOT affiliated with that company. We will depart from Bethany Baptist Church in Winston-Salem, NC, where we will leave our vehicles. We will be staying at the Baymont Inn and Suites, 203 E Front Street, Metropolis, IL (8 miles from the Quilt Museum). Each room has two double beds, free wi-fi, and hairdryer in the bathroom.
