Quilts of Valor News

We're approaching 20 nominees for the October award ceremony but we're not maxed out yet. We would like to stop taking applications September 1 so think about those deserving veterans you come in contact with or know and get those nominations to me. We will do our best to have a quilt for all nominees on October 3. Since we will be doing this only once each year going forward, we don't want anyone to wait longer than necessary for a quilt.

We really appreciate those who have been so supportive of our efforts. We just ask that you keep in mind that the QOV Foundation's recommended size is 60" x 80". The minimum size is 55" x 75" and the maximum size is 72" x 90". Whenever we receive tops that are below the minimum, we add sufficient borders to meet the minimum of recommended size, whichever works best on the top, so it's not the end of the world if you give us a top that is too small.

Don't forget that I have fabric, if you want to stop by my sewing room.

We celebrated our guild birthday with refreshments before the meeting. LaWonne McCoy, our new President opened the meeting. She asked the original members to stand and be recognized.

Birthdays for August: Shirley Sink, Linda Fishell, and Elaine Fotia. Several wedding anniversaries in August. All were 40 years plus. Prayers for Linda Nichols, Diana's first cousin, Terry's brother, LaWonne's sister, and Wanda Welborn's husband Clifford.

LaWonne turned over the meeting to our Vice President, Jessica Shouse.

Jessica introduced our speaker, Lee Monroe. Lee is a graphic designer, and she explained the color wheel and how to pick colors according to what you are trying to achieve. In addition to her presentation, she is having a workshop (8/20) to give us tips and tricks for color presentation.

Tracy presented signed quilt blocks and flowers from all of us to Alice Wise, our outgoing President of two years.

Diana suggested that all members can contribute with refreshments for our meetings.

Minutes from the July meeting were approved by motion of Tracy, and second by Alice.

Budget: A discussion ensued regarding the line item for the quilt show loan of \$1,500.00. It is listed as an expense, however, Ellen suggested that a line item for this amount should also be on the income side to wash out the expense.

Treasurer's report was approved by Ellen, and second by Judy.

Budget approved by motion from Hope, second by Janet.

Outreach by Linda. We received a thank you card from Sally. She is the person that distributes our quilts to Oncology at Baptist.

Quilts of Valor by Marty. Instead of several presentations during our fiscal year, we will have only one in October. Marty wants the members that made the quilts to present them to each individual. We will have refreshments and she asked for volunteers to bring finger foods. The event is on Facebook to sign up.

Tracy indicated that there is a change in venue for the retreat in October of next year. The current location of Haw River, has gone up considerably. The new venue will be Walter Johnson in Denton.

On our Facebook group page, Tracy has set up a welcome to new members to the Group, NOT new members of the Guild.

Tracy gave out 4 door prizes.

Sew day is next Monday, 8/14. Cindi showed us the new Raffle quilt. The current quilt was be given away in September. Dawn will do the label for the back, and Cindi will add the binding. She asked for volunteers to help with hand sewing the binding on. A room has been reserved at the Kernersville library on 8/19. Mark will do the marketing for our tickets with the new quilt: "Follow your Heart".

The contract has been signed for the WS Fairgrounds, the cost went up \$1,000.00. Terry has contracted Lisa Alley to be our judge for the show.

Jessica asked for some new ideas. TidBits, maybe a new 15 minute instruction of something you specialize in. Maybe flags for the front door, welcome signs, mug rugs, etc. whatever you can contribute. We are looking at all options for money making objects for the show. Lewis volunteered to long arm items that can be done several at a time.

Ellen went over several changes to the categories for the quilt show. Quilt show entry forms, rules and definitions will be in the next newsletter and on our website.

Show and tell. The theme for the August/September monthly mini is "When I was a teenager".

Quilt Show Definitions

Pieced – Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount and effect.

Appliqué – Appliqué predominates over other techniques in amount and effect. Appliqué method may be hand or machine.

Mixed technique – Combines two or more techniques, i.e. Appliqué & piecing, embroidery & piecing.

Solo – Planned, created and quilted by the entrant only.

Duet – Planned, created and quilted by *more than one person*.

Guild Challenge Quilt – Completely follow the guidelines of the quilt challenge. Entry must be made solely by the entrant.

Quilt Kit or Block of the Month – Quilts made from a kit or Block of the Month program *where the fabrics for the blocks were provided* by a quilt pattern designer or quilt shop.

Miniature Quilt – May not be larger than 24” on any side. All aspects of the design reduced in scale of a large quilt design. Maximum size of individual blocks will be 4 inches. Must be quilted.

Wearable/Fashion Quilting – Garment or fashionable accessory that is predominately quilted.

Home Decoration – Quilted item created for the use of sitting on a table, chair or similar item.

Art Quilt – Must be an original design and made solely by the entrant. No commercial patterns.

Specialty Quilts - at least one half of the quilt contains one or more of these techniques:

Wholecloth Quilt – Quilt contains no piecing, only quilting. Can include pre-printed fabric.

Pictorial or Naturescape Quilt – Quilt that reflects the scenery found in nature, such as land, mountains, oceans, forests, gardens and deserts. Animals and humans may be included.

Painted Quilt – Painting technique by use of markers, pencils, pens, paints, etc. that predominantly colors the surface of the quilt or is the feature accent of the item.

Crazy Quilt – Quilt made with patches of randomly varying sizes, shapes, colors and fabrics.

Cathedral Window or Yoyo quilt – Quilt predominately made from either of these techniques.

Embroidered Quilt: Embroidered design/designs create focal point of the quilt. Does not include quilting on embroidery machine.

Other – any technique not yet described.

Longarm (track mounted) Quilting – Fabric stays stationary while sewing machine moves.

Home (stationary) Machine Quilting – Machine stays stationary while fabric moves (includes embroidery machine quilting).

Hand Quilting – Quilting completed without the use of machinery.

Display Only - quilt will be shown in the appropriate category but not be judged. These entries will be indicated on the description tag on the quilt.

Awards MAY be given for: First, Second, Third Place or Honorable Mention Place in Category, Best of Show, Judges Choice, Best Track Mounted Machine Quilting, Best Hand Quilting, Best Stationary Machine Quilting, Best Use of Color and Best Appliqué. Viewer’s Choice to be determined by show attendees votes.



2024 Quilt Show Rules - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. Entrants must be current members of the Heart of the Triad Quilt Guild, Inc. as of March 4, 2024.
2. The fee is \$6.00 per entry. There is no fee for the Challenge Quilts.
3. Each entered item must have its own entry form completed entirely and accurately.
4. Please include a printed color image (4"x 6") of your entered item, **do not staple to form**.
5. Entries cannot have been entered in a previous Heart of the Triad Quilt Guild, Inc. show.
6. Entry must have been completed since April 2019 (5 years).
7. The Show Committee and/or Judges reserve the right to divide or combine categories and to move entries to a more appropriate category.
8. HOTTQG members may enter any number of quilts but they must be ranked in priority by the maker with #1 being the highest. These rankings will assist the show committee with display design.
9. Entries must be completed and clean.
10. All judged items must be quilted, with the exception of wearable art, cathedral windows, crazy quilts, or yo-yos.
11. All quilts must have a four (4) inch hanging sleeve SEWN securely to the top edge with the exception of miniature quilts and miscellaneous items.
12. Quilt entries must have a label on the back lower left corner with name of the quilt, maker, and year of completion.
13. Entry forms must be postmarked or delivered at a meeting to Ellen Hart by **Monday, April 1, 2024**.
14. To enter, please bring your completed form(s), photo(s) and entry fee(s) to a guild meeting or mail to: Ellen Hart, 415 Cool Springs Road, Winston Salem, NC 27107
15. Quilts will be received on **Tuesday, May 14th, 2024 from 1:00 pm to 7:00pm** at the Swisher Center, 1108 Swisher Center Road, Kernersville, NC
16. Each entry must be placed in a clean cotton pillow case with the *name of the entry and maker's name* clearly labeled on the outside of the pillow case.
17. All entries must be picked up from the quilt show venue (Neil Bolton Home and Garden Building at the Winston Salem Fairgrounds) on **Saturday, May 18th, 2024 beginning at 4:00 pm** after close of the show. You must sign for each item to be picked up.
18. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE RETURNED BY MAIL.

- 1100 **Large Pieced Solo** (300" or greater perimeter) *made entirely by one person.* Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
- 1200 **Medium Pieced Solo** (220" to 299" perimeter) *made entirely by one person.* Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
- 1300 **Small Pieced Solo** (less than 220" perimeter) *made entirely by one person.* Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
- 1400 **Large Pieced Duet** (300" or greater perimeter) *made by more than one person (including quilter).* Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
- 1500 **Medium Pieced Duet** (220" to 299" perimeter) *made by more than one person (including quilter).* Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
- 1600 **Small Pieced Duet** (less than 220" perimeter) *made by more than one person (including quilter).* Piecing predominates over other techniques in amount or effect.
- 2000 **Large Appliqué or mixed technique Solo** (more than 280" perimeter) *made entirely by one person.*
Appliqué: Appliqué technique predominates over other techniques in amount or effect. *Mixed technique:* Two or more major techniques, not counting quilting, used to develop design of the top.

- 2100 **Small Appliqué or mixed technique Solo** (less than 280" perimeter) *made entirely by one person.*
Appliqué: Appliqué technique predominates over other techniques in amount or effect. *Mixed technique:* Two or more major techniques, not counting quilting, used to develop design of the top.
- 2200 **Large Appliqué or mixed technique Duet** (more than 280" perimeter) *made by more than one person (including quilter).* *Appliqué:* Appliqué technique predominates over other techniques in amount or effect. *Mixed technique:* Two or more major techniques, not counting quilting, used to develop design of the top.
- 2300 **Small Appliqué or mixed technique Duet** (less than 280" perimeter) *made by more than one person (including quilter).* *Appliqué:* Appliqué technique predominates over other techniques in amount or effect. *Mixed technique:* Two or more major techniques, not counting quilting, used to develop design of the top.
- 3000 **Guild Challenge:** Follow Challenge quilt guidelines. *Must be made entirely by one person.*
- 4000 **Kit or BOM:** All quilts made from a kit or Block of the Month program **where the fabrics for the blocks were provided.** Not eligible for **Best Use of Color** award.
- 5000 **Art Quilt:** Quilt that is an original design and made solely by one person. No commercial patterns.
- 6000 **Miniature Quilt:** May not be larger than 24" square, all aspects of design reduced in scale of large quilt design, maximum size of individual blocks to be 4". Must be quilted.
- 7000 **Specialty Quilt:** Quilt that uses a special technique to develop the design of the top such as whole cloth, crazy quilt, cathedral window, yo-yo, embroidered, etc. *At least half the quilt top must incorporate the special technique.* Unquilted entries will not be considered for **Best of Show** award.
- 8000 **Wearables, Fashion and Miscellaneous Quilted Items:** Clothing, hats, totes, purses, stockings, table runners, place mats, etc. Not eligible for **Best of Show** award.

Note: *Categories may be subdivided or combined as needed. Judging and show coordinators reserve the right to move your entry to a more appropriate category.*

Note: *Your designated priority rating may be used to determine priority of presentation for display.*

Note: *All quilts will be judged and you will receive the judge's comments, (unless designated as display only entry).*

All persons involved in making the quilt should be listed on this entry form. If the design is not the entrant's original design, credit must be given to the source.

I have read the rules and agree, and I acknowledge that I wish to enter the above item and agree to abide by all quilt contest rules as well as any decision of the judge(s). I certify that this application has been filled out in its entirety and is complete, true and accurate to the best of my information, knowledge and belief.
