I also would like to thank Hope and Nicole for agreeing to take over Quilts of Valor. Thanks so much.

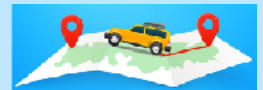

Amy Illerbrun opened the meeting at 6:30 PM. Visitors and new members were greeted with a warm welcome from all.

Sharon Dorminey introduce our guest speaker, Sally Wincze. Sally did an excellent presentation on the 'Evolution of a Fiber Artist and Wearable Art'.

Business Meeting

After a brief recess so that members could look closely at Sally's work, Amy continued the meeting with anyone who had someone to keep in our thoughts and prayers. Members who had June birthdays were recognized.

Treasurer's Report: Penny Nolan stated the balance in the checking account was \$11,360.96. Sharon Dorminey made a motion to accept the report and Judi Low seconded that motion. The members voted unanimously to accept the report.

May Meeting Minutes: the minutes from the May meeting were presented in the newsletter. There was no discussion or concerns with the minutes and Janet Downing made a motion to accept the minutes and Alice Wise seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Dues: The Executive board proposed an increase in dues to \$35 for regular members and \$30 for age 65 and over. A lengthy discussion followed. Quite a few members felt that a \$10 increase would be too much and put a strain on many people. An amount of **\$30 for regular members and \$25 for age 65 and older** was proposed by the membership. Majority of the Executive Board was present and agreed. Motion was made on the floor by Cindy Sullivan, seconded by Treva Fuller. New dues amount was voted in by majority. **These dues will not take effect until NEXT YEAR. Please pay the current dues for 2025, \$25 or \$20 for seniors.**

Quilt Show was discussed again. We have been having problems getting someone to step up as a chairperson. It was discussed whether to show should be put off a year, but members had said that would interfere with other Guilds shows. It was then discussed that if we did not have a Chairperson by the end of the nights meeting, a motion be made to delay the show until 2028. However, this would significantly effect our budget and how the guild schedules programs and/or workshops since the show brings in a big amount for our budget. We did have a brand new member, Jean, step up and volunteer to Chair the show! Of course, the guild will all help her.

Door Prizes were awarded.

Community outreach: Linda Fishell recognized and gave thanks to all who attended the Saturday Sew Day at the Kernersville Library. Twenty quilt backs were put together! She also thanked all who returned items before the meeting or took projects home.

Quilts of Valor: Hope Geoghegan and Nicole Corbin are coordinating with Tracy Burkart to take over these duties. Stay tuned for updates.

Raffle Trip: Penny Nolan and Cindy Sullivan gave an update on the sales and locations of where they are heading. Cindy has gotten permission to attend the Concord Quilt Show on June 20th and 21st. Shae Simmonds has coordinated with her other guild Orange-Durham to sell tickets. She and Cindy Sullivan will be going there in July.

Sew Day: The next Sew Day is June 9th at the Swisher Center from 9am- 4pm.

Guild meetings will continue at the Sedge Garden Community Center throughout the summer and resume at Swisher Center for our October Meeting. We have September off for Labor Day.

Show and Tell projects were presented by our members.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20pm.
