Amy Illerbrun opened the meeting at 6:07 pm. She welcomed two visitors and one new member.

There was discussion that Pineapple Quilts has pallets of quilts for WNC and if anyone is going that direction to please pick up and deliver whatever number of quilts they are able to transport. Also, members were told that Pineapple closed on October 31st, but they are having one more sale on November 14 – 16.

Amy introduced our guest speaker, Dan Low who is Judi Low's husband. Dan is currently working at Sew Original in Winston-Salem as a sewing machine technician. He shared with the members some of his sewing machine knowledge and how to care of our machines.

Amy began the business portion of the meeting by congratulating those who are celebrating birthdays in November.

Amy asked for approval of the October minutes. Linda Whicker pointed out that in October we had approval and a second for the Treasurer's Report, but no vote was taken. There was then discussion on the need to amend the October Minutes to reflect a vote. Approval to amend was given by Cindi Sullivan and seconded by Nancy Toth. The amended minutes were voted on and unanimously approved by the attending members.

Linda Fishell (Community Outreach) read a thank you card "Blessed are the Givers" and said this is why we make charity quilts. Linda asked that anyone who has taken a strip set home, but cannot work on it to please return it to her. Linda will be available the next Sew Day on November 18th to demonstrate the quilt as you go and sew-on binding methods. If you plan to sew that day, she asked that the bring your own machine with a walking foot, gray thread and an extension cord.

The next Sew Day will be on November 18th instead of the 11th because the Swisher Center is closed on the Veteran's Day holiday. On sew days members may bring any type of project they wish to work on that day.

The next Guild board meeting will be Thursday November 7th at 1:00 pm at the Kernersville Library. All are invited to attend. Please send any comments or suggestions to Amy.

Door prizes were distributed with Show and Tell to follow.

Cindi Sullivan encouraged members to participate next year in the Quilt Retreat. She said it is an enjoyable experience and that more people are needed to attend next year.
