Program December 7th Zoom Meeting

The December program will be a show and tell of all our Christmas gifts we have made. Please share your "made with love" gifts during our Zoom meeting.

November 2, 2020 Meeting Minutes:

The Zoom meeting was called to order at 6:30. 24 members were present.

Tabitha Southard started our meeting with a 15-minute chair yoga session. She emphasized light stretching to use while quilting or anytime we need to ease tension.

Our presenter this evening was Bonnie Shropshire. She is from Mt Airy and the Surry County Quilt Guild. She is a quilt artist who demonstrated how to color onto fabrics. She uses Inktense pens or watercolor pencils and a textile medium to bond the color into the fabric. Then it's heat set with an iron. The colored fabrics can become part of quilt blocks or labels and can be fused or appliquéd.

Door Prize - Gloria Stickney was tonight's winner.

Minutes - The October, 2020 minutes were approved as corrected for Prudence Dawson's name.

Treasurer's Report – There were no new receipts or disbursements in October.

Committees:

Community Outreach - Linda Fishell has projects available to pickup. Contact her to volunteer for a task. Work in this area has dropped off due to COVID, however the need for completed quilts is still great.

Quilts of Valor - Tracy Burkart reported that the October 17th presentation went well. Additionally, she has several individual presentations to schedule.

Opportunity (Raffle) Quilt - Cindi Sullivan displayed the quilt at Studio Stitch. Ticket sales were \$39. Although sales were light, as we get closer to the 2022 show, sales will likely improve.

Quilt Show - The fees for use of the Winston-Salem Fairgrounds will remain the same as they were for our last show. Our \$900 paid deposit has been transferred to 2022. The show dates are April 7 (setup day) and April 8-9 (show).

Membership – Alice Wise reported that we have 40 paid members. She is creating a new directory by November 15th.

Show and Tell - Janet Downing, Gloria Stickney, Cindi Sullivan, Ann Everett, and Fran Fisher presented their projects.

Cleanout of the storage facility is scheduled for 11/10/20. Contact Marty Smith to participate.

Marty Smith has signed a new agreement for the Sedge Garden facility. It's possible that small gatherings can be accommodated, perhaps for a Sew Day.

For our December meeting, members are encouraged to show Christmas projects they've been working on.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40.
